Doing our part in the community: Stanford's new package of community benefits

Our proposed General Use Permit and recently announced community benefits package exceeds many of the requirements Santa Clara County has laid out for Stanford—building housing now, investing more in transportation improvements that encourage sustainable commuting, and providing support to Palo Alto Unified School District (PAUSD). This additional package of community benefits is responsive to community needs and aligned with Stanford's values as a residential university committed to sustainable development and service to the community and its residents, our neighbors.

Stanford's comprehensive \$4.7 billion community benefits package, including \$3.4 billion for housing and \$1.1 billion for transportation, will ensure that the General Use Permit meets the needs of the County, community and university.
